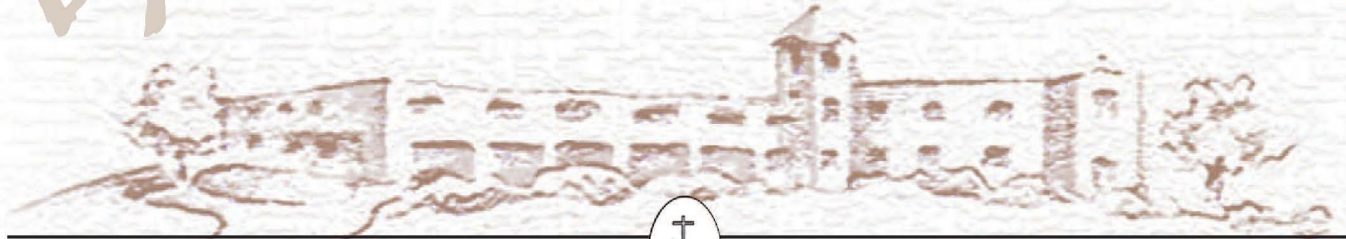

This coming Advent the Church will initiate its revised English translation of the 'Order' for the Eucharist (most of the changes are for the presiding celebrant); it is a more faithful translation of the Latin text as well as it being richer in theological and spiritual language. As with any change, it may be difficult to adapt at first but the essence of the sacrifice is not changed [The Spanish Missal will have no changes since it is already closer to the Latin text]. This is only one more section of the journey that we are on. Let us not murmur as our forefathers did in the desert; let us not create a tempest in a teapot; let us

prepare and accept and pray that we will enter deeper into the central mystery of our sacramental faith, that we may truly offer ourselves with the Bread and the Wine as we pilgrim our way to our True Home.

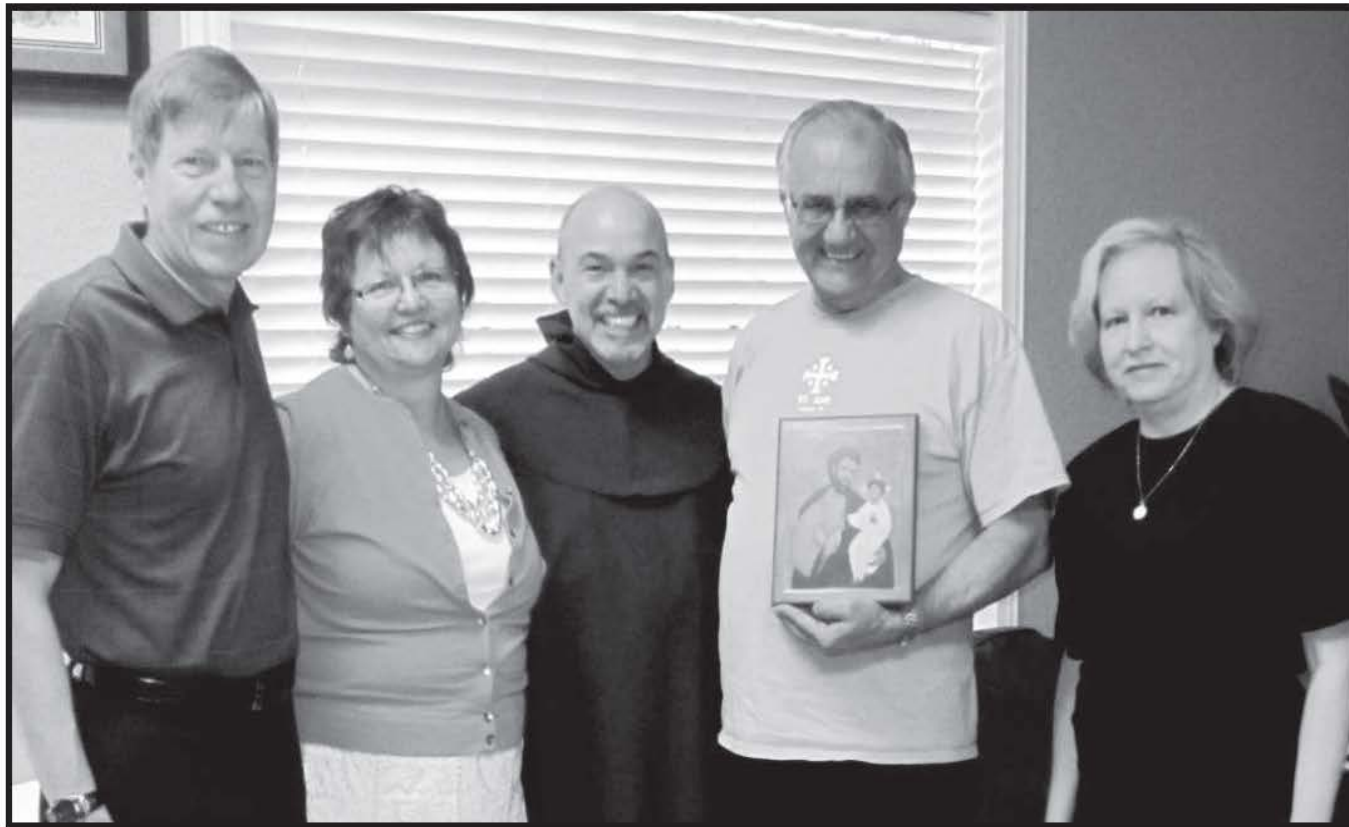
May the Light of the Holy Spirit light our pilgrim way, that we may find ourselves at the end of our journey in the bosom of the Holy Trinity –

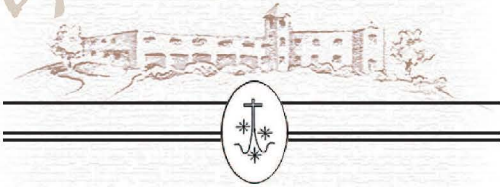
Saturday, December 3rd AND Saturday, December 10th – from 10am to 12pm
