

Thérèse bears powerful witness that in giving us his Son, God didn't come for the righteous but for sinners.

(Lk 5: 32)

"My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12:9) This was Christ's response to St. Paul as he pleaded with the Lord to take away his human fragility. These words point to a great mystery experienced by everyone who has made a sincere effort to faithfully follow Christ, the interplay of the divine life and human weakness. A saint who has been particularly prominent shedding light into this mystery is St. Thérèse of Lisieux.


Few saints have had the profound impact she has had in the life of the Church in these last centuries. The greatness of her life and message lies in her ability to take us to the very heart of the Gospel in a simple and direct way, accessible to all. And what is the heart of the Gospel? It's "the revelation in Jesus Christ of God's mercy to sinners." (CCC 1846). Thérèse bears powerful witness that in giving us his Son, God didn't come for the righteous but for sinners (Lk 5: 32), for the weak and broken, those in most need of redemption.

Therefore, this Doctor of the Church reminds us that redemption is first and foremost a gift from God and not so much a task to be achieved to prove our spiritual muscle power. Her message is a corrective one to the frequent mistake of being too absorbed in ourselves thinking that Christianity is mainly about us: what we do, what we don't do, how well we do it, making us completely self-referential instead of God-referential. Thérèse shows us not to be preoccupied with measuring our spiritual progress or lack of it, but to love freely and selflessly, humbly recognizing our poverty and imperfections with a constant and confident appeal to God's merciful love. She, thus, places in the light of God's love the universal and timeless human dilemmas of sin, weakness, limitations, feelings of guilt and shame ,as well as, the quest for truth and meaning in the midst of life circumstances that can give us the sensation of being existentially adrift. This is why this young woman's life and message has become so pertinent in our times.

It is the message and life witness of this simple and, yet, most remarkable woman that we want to share with all at Mt. Carmel Center in our upcoming Fall program. We invite you to join us and getting to know her whom Pope Pius X called "the greatest saint of modern times" and explore with us new depths of the ocean of God's merciful love.





St. Thérèse Mass of the Roses


